are its purposes.

The Welsh Youth Town Council was created as a way for young people to have their say on what needs to be done in Burry Port and Pembrey. The Youth Town Council allows young people to discuss relevant issues, make decisions for themselves and improve the lives of the young people within their community.

The overall aim for the Youth Town Council is to improve the facilities and resources in Burry Port and Pembrey for teenagers.

After comparing the two Baby/Youth Councils, the Welsh, Italian, Bulgarian and Portuguese pupils, on the occasion of the celebration of the Italian flag festival, talked and showed Powerpoints on the history of their own flag, giving the opportunity to all the teachers and pupils present in the Council Chamber, to share information and learn about the culture of the partner countries.
